

Online Entries...

You may complete entries <u>online</u> for all the competition categories except the Culinary Competition and Theme Photo Competition. Go to our website at <u>sandwichfair.com</u> where you'll find the link to "Online Entries" on the home page. From that point you will be transferred to our online entry site. You will be guided to fill out your entry form, pay for your entries, and <u>print a receipt</u>* for you to hold until you come to our <u>Fair Office</u> or <u>Livestock Office</u> to pick up your entry tags and exhibitor pass.

The advantage - Do your entries from the convenience of your home computer. The online entry site will allow you to add to your entry until the time when your information is downloaded to our system here at the Fair Office. You will know when this occurs when you have paid for and received a receipt. PRINT the receipt for your records. Only 1 download is accepted per exhibitor. Remember, don't add to your entries once you have paid for and downloaded your entries. From that point no additions or changes will be accepted. Please note that there is a \$2.00 per person credit card convenience fee automatically added to your on-line entry. This fee is in addition to normal entry fees.

The entry descriptions listed in this book and on our website are complete descriptions whereas the online descriptions are abbreviated due to space restrictions. If you need to be sure about the entry you wish to enter, first check out the Exhibitor's Guide here or at <u>sandwichfair.com</u>, then go to the Online Entries site and complete your entry. You may wish to use the entry forms in this book or print out the entry form from our <u>sandwichfair.com</u> website and use it as a worksheet before doing your final entry on the Online Entries site.

*For Livestock entries: Please make sure you have printed a receipt and bring that receipt when you check-in at the Livestock Office.

How to Enter Items in the Fair

<u>Open Class / Open Class Livestock Departments</u> are open to anyone who wishes to compete in the Sandwich Fair. Complete the <u>white</u> *Open Show Entry Form* or *Open Show Livestock Entry Form* in the back of this book.

Junior Class / Junior Class Livestock Departments are eligible for Premium State Aid only if they are open to boys and girls who are 8 years of age, or in the third grade, and not yet 21 years of age on or before September 1 of the year previous to the fair. All animals shown in junior classes must be the property of the boys and girls showing them. If the same animals are shown in both the open classes and junior classes, they shall be shown under the same exhibitor's name (for example, the father is not permitted to show an animal in the open class and the son or daughter show the same animal in the junior class). Complete the yellow Junior Show Entry Form at the end of the Junior Livestock listings in this book. There is a specific form for livestock entries and one for general entries. Use of the wrong form may cause your entry to be incorrectly processed.

There are two (2) methods to enter competitive exhibits: **Online Entries** OR **Paper Entries**.

<u>Online Entries:</u> can be processed by following the "Online Entries" link found on the Sandwich Fair Web site at...

Paper Entries:

- Select Dept, Category, & Entry # from the current Exhibitor's Guide. Enter as many items as you wish, but only one entry is allowed for each Entry number.
- 2. Fill out the appropriate entry form **COMPLETELY**, from the back of the book.
- 3. Exhibitors, be sure your entry form is complete. There will be no additional entries or changes once your entry is processed at the Fair Office.
- 4. Make a copy of your entry form for your records.
- 5. A check for appropriate entry fees and Fair Exhibitor pass fees (Open \$20.00, Junior \$8.00) must accompany all paper entry forms.
- 6. Entry forms must be postmarked or received at the Fair Office by 6:00 p.m. of the August 26, 2022 deadline. NO EXCEPTIONS!

Please be sure and read the information provided at the beginning of each department.

Information may vary from one department to another, including hours of operation for dropping off and picking up your items. Also included are phone numbers for departmental superintendents who can answer questions you may have.

Entry Tag Packets:

- 1. Open Show Entry tags will be available for pick up at the Fair Office starting September 2, 2022.
- 2. Take the packet home and attach an entry tag to each item entered. Do not tear the entry tag apart! (See Department rules at the beginning of each department in this book.) Entry Tag Packets contain: Tags for each exhibit entry, and 1 exhibitor ticket which allows entry to the Fair all 5 days.
- **3.** If original entry tag has been altered, that item will be disqualified and will not be judged.

Fair Week:

- 1. Fair office will be open from 9 am to 6 pm Monday (Labor Day), and Tuesday.
- 2. Items to be entered must be brought to the Fairgrounds for judging on Monday and Tuesday of Fair week. Times are listed in guidelines before each department in this premium book.
- **3.** Exhibits are then taken by exhibitor, to the proper building and left with the superintendent there.
- **4.** Entries will not be allowed to be picked up until approved release time on Sunday of Fair Week. Item pick- up at the end of the Fair is as follows: Buildings will be closed Sunday from 6:00 6:30 PM to organize for item pick up.

Exhibit Pick up times: Sunday 6:30-8:00 PM

Monday 9:00 AM - 11:00 AM

Horticulture Building: Monday 8.00am-11.00 AM Photography/Arts & Crafts: Monday 9:00am - Noon

Premium Checks:

Exhibitors may pick up their Premium Checks at the Fair Office building (1401 Suydam Road), 2 ways:

- A. During the Fair, <u>Sunday</u>, <u>12-8 PM ONLY</u>—Back door of Fair Office
- B. After the Fair, (Monday-Friday) 10 AM 2 PM front door of Fair Office until 10/7.
- **C.** Special check pick-up Saturday September 17th from 10-2 PM.

No checks will be mailed! The Illinois Department of Agriculture requires a signature for each premium check awarded to Fair participants.

- **1.** No prizes are given for exhibits not listed in this premium book.
- 2. Premiums will be paid by going to the Fair Office building, next to the Ticket Office (read times above). Provide a Photo ID and signature in the Premium Check State of Illinois Book.
- 3. All premium checks MUST be picked up. No checks will be issued without Photo ID and your signature on the proper paperwork.

Post Fair Information

- **1.** The Sandwich Fair Association is not responsible for exhibits left after 8:00 PM Sunday of the Fair.
- 2. Exhibits not picked up following the Fair will be disposed of by October 7, 2022. No exceptions!

SANDWICH FAIRGROUNDS RULES, REGULATIONS, AND INFORMATION FOR ALL EXHIBITORS

- 1. The Sandwich Fair Association, Inc. reserves the final and absolute right to interpret the rules, regulations, and information in this premium book and to arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions, or differences in regard thereto. It further reserves the right to amend or add to the rules, regulations, and information as in its judgment it may determine necessary and to withdraw all premium offerings in all departments should an emergency exist and circumstances demand it.
- 2. Each entry form must be complete including the exhibitor's social security number.
- 3. One exhibitor ticket admits one person to the Sandwich Fair all five days of the fair.
- 4. Exhibitor tickets and entry tags will not be mailed. They will be available for pick up at the Fair Office and Livestock Office, on Monday or Tuesday before the fair.
- 5. Specific rules for each department are found at the beginning of the premium listings for that department. Any questions about those rules are to be directed to the department superintendent. Telephone numbers for superintendents are included in the Exhibitor Guide.
- 6. The Sandwich Fair Association, Inc. will make every effort to protect property while on the fairgrounds but will not be responsible for loss or damage to property.
- 7. All superintendents have the authority to eliminate from exhibition any animal or exhibit that does not comply with all rules and regulations.
- 8. Exhibitors will be expected to observe the rules of good conduct while on the fairgrounds. Superintendents may eliminate from competition those failing to meet this requirement.
- 9. The management reserves the right to postpone the time for exhibition of any class, article, or animal because of inclement weather or for any other good and sufficient reason.
- 10. No dogs or other pets are allowed on the fairgrounds. Work dogs assisting a person with a disability are welcome.

AWARDS

- All protests must be made in writing, verified by affidavit, and when
 made against the exhibition of any animal or article, must be filed
 with the Secretary as soon as an objection is known to exist. A
 failure to observe this requirement will be considered waiver of all
 such objections by the party protesting. All such protests regularly
 made will be considered by the Grievance Committee before the
 awards are made.
- All protests against awards, except in the speed class, must be filed with the Secretary on or before 4:00 pm of the last day of the Fair, and will be considered by the Board of Directors at its next meeting, at which time and place all persons interested may be present and submit evidence
- 3. In addition to right of protest guaranteed to exhibitors and persons interested, this Association reserves the right to take cognizance of fraud, practiced or attempted of any violation of the rules or of any failure or neglect to comply with the published conditions of this Association and the Board of Directors may make such order and disposition of all matters as may seem to them just and proper.
- 4. No person shall act as judge in a class in which he may be interested as owner, exhibitor, agent, employee of an exhibitor, or in any class where such judge may be influenced by prejudice, partiality, favor or any other reason likely to prevent a fair award of premiums.

ADDITIONAL RULES, REGULATIONS, AND INFORMATION FOR LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS

- 1. Entries are restricted to space available and will be processed first received first entered. Entries received after stalls and pens are full will be returned to the sender.
- 2. Pick up exhibitor tickets and entry tags at the <u>Livestock Office</u> during office hours.
- 3. Junior exhibitors wishing to exhibit in Open and Junior shows must pay the Open Show fee. Stall and pen rent are required for both shows.
- 4. All animals shown in the Junior show must have been the property of the exhibitor for at least sixty (60) days before the show. The only exceptions are animals sold with rights to show.
- 5. Open show livestock must be in place on the fairgrounds by 10:00 pm on Tuesday of Fair Week.
- 6. Junior show livestock is not allowed on the fairgrounds before 6:00 pm on Friday of Fair Week.
- 7. Bring health papers to the Livestock Office.
- 8. No livestock can be left in trucks or trailers. Livestock must be penned or stalled as directed by the superintendents.
- 9. All livestock exhibitor's cars, trailers, and trucks will be permitted in the livestock exhibit area to deliver feed and supplies until 9:00 am every day of the fair. Any car, trailer, or truck found in the livestock exhibit area after 9:00 am will be towed into the parking area at the owner's expense. This rule is ordered by the State Fire Marshal and will be enforced.
- 10. Open show livestock premiums will be paid late Friday afternoon in the barns by the superintendent of each department.
- 11. Junior show premiums will be paid Sunday afternoon in the barns by the superintendent of each department.
- 12. All exhibitors must sign a written receipt for all premium checks as required by the state of Illinois.
- 13. No open show livestock can be removed from the fairgrounds before 4:00 pm on Friday of Fair Week.
- 14. No junior show livestock can be removed before 5:00 pm on Sunday of Fair Week.

RULES APPLICABLE TO ANIMALS

- 1. All animals entered must be free from disease. Any symptoms of disease occurring after an animal is upon the grounds will warrant its removal by the Sandwich Fair Association.
- 2. No animal or article on exhibition can be removed from the grounds until the close of the Fair without the Superintendent's consent.

2021 Illinois Exhibition Health Requirements
County Fairs

CERTIFICATES OF VETERINARY INSPECTION AND/OR TEST RECORDS MUST BE AVAILABLE FOR INSPECTION AT ANY TIME WHILE ANIMALS ARE ON THE FAIR-GROUNDS.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

These Exhibition Health Requirements apply to all livestock present at the Fair including those animals that are not entered in competitive events.

 Exhibitors are required to familiarize themselves with all rules applicable to their exhibits.

All out-of-state animals shall require an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, at 217/782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at: http://www.agr.state.il.us/AnimalHW/animalregistry/login.php

All animals, except as noted, shall be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) which shows that the animal meets all health requirements for the State of Illinois. CVI's shall be made available to Bureau of Animal Health Personnel on request.

CVI means a legible record made on an official form from the state of origin which has been issued, signed and dated by an accredited veterinarian and which shows the name and address of the animal's owner or exhibitor and results of all required tests or vaccinations. A CVI shall list only one animal identification per line; shall be presented on the form on which it was initially issued; and shall not be corrected, changed or altered in any manner.

- All animals shall be officially identified. The animal(s) official identification shall be recorded on the CVI.
- If animals are from tuberculosis accredited, brucellosis certified, pseudorabies qualified, or brucellosis validated herds, the identifying herd number(s) along with the date of the last herd test(s) shall appear on the CVI.
- 5. CVI for out-of-state livestock shall be void thirty (30) days after issuance.
- 6. CVI for Illinois-origin livestock shall be void ninety (90) days after issuance.
- 7. All livestock shall be subject to examination upon entry to any Illinois fair or exhibition. Any animal showing evidence of infectious, contagious or communicable diseases shall be immediately withdrawn and held in quarantine at the owner's risk and expense until properly treated and recovered, or until the animal is released to return to the owner's premise. Any livestock infected with scabies, mange, active lesions of ringworm, soremouth, or multiple warts which are easily visible without close examination shall not be permitted to exhibit and are subject to quarantine or removal from the fairgrounds. Sheep and goats with caseous lymphadenitis as evidenced by draining abscesses shall not be exhibited and are subject to immediate quarantine or removal from the fairgrounds.
- 8. Illinois Department of Agriculture personnel or designee may collect blood, tissue, milk or urine samples from any animal being exhibited and/or raced at any Illinois fair to test for the presence of illegal drugs or banned substances. New examination techniques, such as ultrasound, may also be used at anytime while the animals are on the grounds of any Illinois fair or exhibit. The Illinois Department of Agriculture or designee may collect urine, blood, tissue or other test samples from exhibition animals at the time of slaughter.
- 9. All exhibitors of animals at any Illinois fair or exhibition shall comply with the provisions of the Illinois Humane Care for Animals Act. If violations are observed, the animal(s) will be excused from exhibition and ordered removed from the grounds with all awards being forfeited. Any practice or deviation from normal, accepted care, including physical, medical or mechanical application shall constitute a violation of show rules and may result in the animal(s) disqualification and removal from the fairgrounds.
- Any Illinois cattle, bison, cervidae ro goats being exhibited in non-accredited free states
 must be isolated from the remainder of the her/flock upon return to Illinois and retested
 for tuberculosis 60-120 days post-entry.

CATTLE

Identification

Individual identification of each animal shall be either a fully healed and legible tattoo, approved official ear tag, registration number (can only be used if the tattoo is recorded on the registration certificate or for breeds where pictures are acceptable), or individual brands, if brand is recorded on the registration certificate.

Illinois Cattle

Brucellosis

Illinois is a Bovine Brucellosis Class-Free State. Brucellosis testing s not required for Illinois cattle.

Tuberculosis

Illinois is an Accredited Tuberculosis- Free State. Tuberculin testing is not required for Illinois cattle.

Please note: Illinois calves under 6 months of age, and Illinois steers are not required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

Out-of-State-Cattle

All out-of-state cattle are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, at (217)782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at: http://www.agr.state.il.us/AnimalHW/animalregistry/login.php

Brucellosis

- 1. Female cattle six (6) months of age and older and bulls eighteen (18) months of age and older shall be negative to an official test for brucellosis within thirty (30) days prior to entry, unless exempt by one (1) of the following:
 - A. Originate directly from a certified brucellosis-free herd
 - B. Official vaccinates of dairy breeds under twenty (20) months of age or official vaccinates of beef breeds under twenty-four (24) months of age.
 - Animal originated from a "Class Free" state (if entire state is so classified)
 - Steers and spayed heifers are not required to be tested for brucellosis.
- 2. The negative brucellosis test shall be conducted at a state or federal laboratory within 30 days prior to exhibition.
- . Accredited Tuberculosis Free States
 - A. No tuberculin test required. All cattle, including steers, originating from an Accredited Tuberculosis Free State, may enter Illinois for exhibition when accompanied by a CVI issued by an accredited veterinarian within 30 days.
- 2. Non-accredited Tuberculosis Free Areas or States (Not TB Free)
 - A. Cattle must originate from a herd where a complete herd test was conducted within the past year.
 - B. The individual animals entering Illinois must be negative to an additional tuberculin test conducted within 30 days prior to exhibition.
 - C. Cattle that enter Illinois for exhibition and remain in Illinois (animal does not return to the state of origin within 30 days) must be isolated and retested for TB 60-120 days from the last official TB test date.

SWINE

Illinois Swine

Identification

- 1.Swine shall be identified by an official ear tag, tattoo or recognized breed ear notch.
- 2.Ear notch identification is acceptable for barrows, crossbred gilts and breeding swine.

(Note: Ear notch identification of crossbred swine does not satisfy USDA identification requirements for interstate movement or official testing.)

Brucellosis

Brucellosis testing is not required for Illinois swine.

Pseudorabies

Pseudorabies testing is not required for Illinois swine.

Out-of-State Swine

All out-of-state swine are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, at (217)782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at: http://www.agr.state.il.us/AnimalHW/animalregistry/login.php

Identification

- Individually identified by an official ear tag, tattoo or recognized breed ear notch.
- 2. Ear notch identification is not acceptable for crossbred animals.

Brucellosis

- Breeding swine 4 months of age and older shall be negative to an official test for brucellosis within 30 days prior to exhibition unless exempt by one (1) of the following:
 - A. Originate immediately and directly from a validated-brucellosis-free herd.
 - B. Originate directly from a validated brucellosis-free state
- Swine brucellosis tests for exhibition shall be conducted at a state or federal laboratory.

Pseudorabies

1.Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage IV or V state are exempt from the pseudorabies testing requirement.

- 2.Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage III state shall be negative to an official test for pseudorabies conducted within thirty (30) days prior to entry or originate immediately and directly from a qualified pseudorabies negative herd.
- 3.Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage I or II state shall be negative to an official test for pseudorabies conducted within the 10 days prior to entry.
- 4.Barrows and females in market classes must meet the same requirements as breeding swine.

SHEEP

Identification

Individual identification of each animal shall be by an ear tattoo or official metal or plastic tag. A microchip ID is acceptable if the owner provides the reader.

Ear tattoos may be used when a registration certificate, listing the tattoo number, accompanies the animal.

When using ear tags, the tag must indicate the premises ID and state of origin. The tag number must be assigned by a state or APHIS representative and recorded in the Scrapie Record Database.

Market Lambs

All market lambs must be slick shorn (show ring ready) before weigh-in so that show lamb fungus can be identified.

Illinois Sheep

- 1. Sheep originating from a herd or flock that has previously been classified as either an infected or source herd or flock can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved herd/flock plan.
- 2.For any animal born after 1/1/2002, the CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

Out-of-State Sheep

All out-of-state sheep are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, at (217)782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at: http://www.agr.state.il.us/AnimalHW/animalregistry/login.php

- Sheep originating from a flock that has previously been classified as either an infected or source flock can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved flock plan.
- For any animal born after 1/1/2002, the CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

GOATS

Identification

- -Individual identification of each animal shall be by an ear tattoo or official metal or plastic tag. A microchip ID is acceptable if the owner provides the reader.
- -Tattoos may be used when a registration certificate, listing the tattoo number, accompanies the animal.
- -When using ear tags, the tag must indicate the premises ID and state of origin.
- -The tag number must be assigned by a state or APHIS representative and recorded in the Scrapie Record Database.
- -Ears should be used for tattooing when possible. If there is no space in the ear, the flank or tail fold may be used.

Illinois Goats

 Goats originating from a herd that has previously been classified as either an infected or source herd can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved herd plan. 2. For any animal born after 1/1/2002, the CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

Out-of-State Goats

All out-of-state goats are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, at (217)782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at: http://www.agr.state.il.us/AnimalHW/animalregistry/login.php

- Goats originating from a herd that has previously been classified as either an infected or source herd can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved herd plan.
- 2. Tuberculosis- Goats from areas or states that are not Accredited Bovine Tuberculosis Free, must be accompanied by a CVI indicating that the goats originated from a herd where a complete negative herd test has been conducted within the past twelve (12) months and the individual animals are negative to a tuberculin test conducted within thirty (30) days prior to entry. For any animal born after 1/1/2002, the CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

HORSES, PONIES, MULES AND OTHER EQUIDAE

Illinois Equine

- All horses and other equidae, twelve (12) months of age and older attending an advertised equine event, shall be accompanied by a negative test for equine infectious anemia (EIA) conducted within the last twelve (12) months. A copy of this test shall accompany the animal.
- 2. AGID (Coggins) or ELISA tests are accepted.
- An advertised equine event means a show, rodeo, sale, auction, exhibition, trail ride, or horse fair that is posted or media promoted.
- 4. A CVI is not required for Illinois equine.

Out-of-State Equine

All out-of-state equine are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, at (217)782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at: http://www.agr.state.il.us/AnimalHW/animalregistry/login.php

- All horses and other equidae entering Illinois that are twelve (12) months
 of age or older, shall be accompanied by a negative test for equine infectious anemia (EIA) conducted within the last twelve (12) months. A copy of
 this test shall accompany the animal.
- 2. AGID (Coggins) or ELISA tests are accepted.
- All horses and other equidae shall be accompanied by a CVI issued within thirty (30) days prior to entry.

POÚLTRY

PLEASE NOTE THE 2021 PULLORUM TESTING WAIVER AT THE END OF THE RULES & REGULATIONS SECTION.

- All entries (except waterfowl, i.e. domesticated fowl that normally swim, such as
 ducks and geese) in a show or exhibition shall have originated from a U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid Clean or equivalent hatchery or flock OR have a negative pullorumtyphoid test within 90 days prior to exhibition. Exhibitor shall show proper information as to name and address of owner or exhibitor, name and address of the
 authorized testing agent, date of the testing and the number, breed, and species
 of those tested.
- Prior to being used to transport poultry to a show, all crates, boxes, containers and vehicles shall be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected.
- Any poultry vaccinations must be performed at least 4 weeks prior to delivery to the show.
- 4. Upon admission to a show, all entries shall be examined by an official county fair veterinarian or qualified state personnel who shall also receive and examine all certificates necessary for admission of birds to a show. Birds not in show condition will be excused from exhibition and removed from the premises. Any fowl showing signs of illness during the fair will be removed from the exhibition grounds.
- 5. All out-of-state turkeys must originate from flocks that are officially classified as U.S. Mycoplasma Gallisepticum Clean in accordance with the provisions of the National Poultry Improvement Plan or be negative to a test for Mycoplasma gallisepticum within 30 days prior to entry.
- A permit is also required for out-of-state poultry. A permit may be obtained by calling (217)782-4944.

Please note: These poultry exhibition requirements do not apply to 4-H and FFA 1-day poultry shows where the entries are taken to the show and returned home the same day. However, a permit is required for out-of-state poultry.

CERVIDAE

(Deer, Elk, Reindeer, Caribou, Moose, Red Deer and other related species) Identification

All animals shall be individually identified with an approved tag, microchip or tattoo. Elk are required to have two official/approved unique identifiers.

Illinois Cervidae

Chronic Wasting Disease

For cervidae changing ownership or moving within the State, the owner must obtain a permit issued by the Department prior to movement and the cervid must originate from a herd that is enrolled in the Certified Monitored Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) Program or the Contained Monitored Chronic Wasting Disease Program. Permits are available from Monday through Friday, 8-4:30 p.m. (CST), by calling (217)782-4944. The permit shall be obtained no more than 72 hours in advance of the movement of the cervids by providing the following information:

- Name and complete mailing address of person exhibiting the cervids;
- B. Certified Monitored Chronic Wasting Disease or Contained Monitored Chronic Wasting Disease Herd number:
- C. Name and complete mailing address of location where the animals will be exhibited;
- D. Number of animals and unique identification of the animals.

Tuberculosis

Illinois is an Accredited Tuberculosis- Free States. Tuberculin test is not required for Illinois cervidae.

Out-of-State Cervidae

Chronic Wasting Disease

1.All cervidae entering Illinois must be in compliance with the Illinois
Wildlife Code [520 ILCS 5]. For more information, contact the
Illinois Department of Natural Resources at (217)782-6384.

2.All cervidae entering Illinois must be accompanied by a permit from the Department and a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection that:

- A. has been issued by an accredited veterinarian of the state of origin or a veterinarian in the employ of the United States Department of Agriculture;
- B. is approved by the Animal Health Official of the state of

origin;

- C. shows that the cervidae are free from visible evidence of any contagious, infectious or communicable disease or exposure thereto, do not originate from a CWD endemic area (any county and surrounding counties where CWD has been diagnosed in the past five years);
- D. shows that the cervidae are not originating from a herd

under quarantine for any contagious, infectious or commu nicable disease;

- E. shows that the animals originate from a herd that has been monitored for at least 5 years under a state-approved CWD certification program.
- A permit number can be obtained Monday through Friday, from 8-4:30 p.m. (CST), by calling (217) 782-4944. Applicant for permit shall furnish the following information to the Department:
 - A. Name and post office mailing address of Illinois destination;
 - B. Name and post office mailing address of the consignor and/or source herds;
 - C. Name and post office mailing address of the herd veterinarian;
 - D. Number and unique identification of cervidae in shipment.

Brucellosis

Cervidae six (6) months of age and older must have a negative brucellosis card or PCFIA test within sixty (60) days prior to entry.

Tuberculosis

1.Accredited Tuberculosis Free States

All cervidae twelve (12) months of age and over shall be negative to two (2) single cervical test for bovine TB no less than ninety (90) days apart with the second test conducted within ninety (90) days prior to entry. These animals shall be isolated from all other members of the herd during the testing period unless they originate from an accredited, qualified or monitored herd.

- A. Červidae from an accredited herd may be moved into Illinois without further TB testing provided that a certificate stating that such cervids originated from an accredited herd accompanies them.
- B. Cervidae originating from qualified or monitored herds may enter with a negative test within ninety (90) days prior to entry and a certificate stating that the animals originate from a monitored herd.
- Non-Accredited Tuberculosis Free Areas or States (Not TB Free)
 All cervidae shall originate from a herd where a complete herd test was conducted within the past year.
 - B. The individual animals entering Illinois must be negative to two (2) additional tuberculin tests conducted within 180 and 30 days prior to entry or exhibition.

RATITES*

(Ostriches, Emus, Rheas, Cassowaries and Kiwis)

Illinois Ratites

There are no requirements governing the movement of ratites within Illinois.

Out-of-State Ratites

- Must be accompanied by a CVI and permit number. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, at (217)782-4944.
- 2. Individually identified by leg band or microchip.
- 3. Negative test for Avian Influenza within 10 days prior to entry.

PIGEONS

There are no requirements governing the movements of pigeons within or into Illinois.

RABBITS

There are no requirements governing the movements of rabbits within or into Illinois.

LLAMAS

There are no requirements governing the movement of Ilamas within Illinois. A permit and health certificate is required for out-of-state Ilamas. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, at (217)782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at: http://www.agr.state.il.us/AnimalHW/animalregistry/login.php

LIVESTOCK EXHIBITOR INFORMATION

We feel it is important to address Foot and Mouth Disease (FMD) with you. FMD is a foreign animal disease and is so classified by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) and the Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA). The fair is keeping abreast of information about the occurrence of FMD in the United Kingdom, France and the Netherlands. We are following the USDA/CFIA recommended practices to insure the safety of your livestock. According to the USDA and the CFIA there are only two continents, North America and Australia, that are free of FMD. Two-thirds of the world lives with FMD in their animals on a daily basis. The occurrences in the United Kingdom, France and the Netherlands have received a great deal of media coverage there as well as the US and Canada. The probability of FMD coming to the US or Canada as a result of these occurrences has increased only slightly. However, awareness of the situation may have decreased the possibility of an occurrence in the US or Canada. Canada and the United States are both very vigilant in the prevention of the spread of FMD, thus making their common border very safe for both countries. Both the USDA Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service and the CFIA have plans to contain occurrences of foreign animal diseases, including FMD.

The USDA plan is called the National Emergency Response to a Highly Contagious Animal Disease and the CFIA plan is the Food and Agriculture Emergency Response System. These plans would be put into effect immediately upon a suspected case of FMD. These plans include varying steps depending on the severity and probability of the suspected case being FMD. State and provincial departments of agriculture have also been having meetings to educate their own employees about this response. Education about FMD is very important. FMD cannot be contracted by humans. FMD in most cases will not kill livestock unless they are young or already in a weakened state. There is a vaccination for FMD. This information approved by the United States Department of Agriculture and the Canadian Food Inspection Agency.

(INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FAIRS AND EXPOSITIONS) NATIONAL CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times deport themselves with honestly and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show. In addition to the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics, fair and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county, state, provincial and national levels. All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitor, fitters, trainers and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethnics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada. The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events.

- 1. All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.
- 2. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible person shall provide animals health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials
- Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.
- 4. Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of drug residues. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer and/or absolutely responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to

be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event which culminates with the animal entering the food chain shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state and provincial statues, regulations and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal, state and provincial statues, regulation and rules affect the animals performance or appearance at the event. If the laboratory report on the chemical analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood, or other substance tested by the laboratory to which it is sent is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise. At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal shall be administered by a licensed veteri-

- 5.. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or dug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, confirmation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoof or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.
- The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.
- 7. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited.

Furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation, and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.

- 8. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.
- 9. The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.
- 10. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to have disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show for violation of this Code of Show Ring ethics and any other rules of competition of the fair or livestock show without recourse against the fair or livestock show. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent that name of the violator or violators in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including Fairs and Expositions and any special notices to members.
- 11. The act of entering of an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal, state or provincial statues, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions. •

ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE BUREAU OF ANIMAL HEALTH & WELFARE May 3, 2021

Salmonella Pullorum Testing Waiver:

The Illinois Poultry Inspection Act, (510 ILCS 85/2.1), states that no hatching eggs or poultry, except poultry for immediate slaughter, shall be bought, sold, transported within or imported into the State unless the hatchery or flock of origin is a participant in the National Poultry Improvement Plan for the eradication of pullorum and fowl typhoid, or is following a program officially approved by the Department. The Administrative Rules (8 Ill. Adm. Code Section 55.70) state that all entries (except waterfowl, i.e., domesticated fowl that normally swim, such as ducks and geese) to a show or exhibition must have come from a U. S. pullorum-typhoid clean or equivalent hatchery or flock; or have a negative pullorum-typhoid test within 90 days prior to exhibition. It should be noted that the United States has not reported Pullorum-Typhoid in the last ten years.

Due to the shortage of antigen necessary to conduct Pullorum-Typhoid testing, the State of Illinois is waiving the pullorum requirements for birds or hatching eggs sold within or imported into the State as well as the testing requirements for exhibition. Once antigen becomes available, this waiver will be rescinded and all flocks participating in the National Poultry Improvement Plan will be required to conduct their annual test. Reciprocity with other states is not guaranteed and producers / exhibitors are responsible for contacting those state officials regarding compliance with entry requirements. Producers can have their veterinarian collect samples and submit them to an approved laboratory for testing that uses alternative methodologies. •

Pens will need to be cleaned by exhibitor because of lack of time from open sheep leaving and junior sheep arriving. Used bedding is to be placed in the manure pit located by the barn and NOT deposited in other pens. Sheep Barn and surrounding area should be raked and kept clean of wool and straw at all times.

MARKET LAMB CLASSES

<u>Competition Day Check In:</u> We accept your entry on stage as early as 45 minutes prior to but no later than 5 minutes before the competition. This is at the discretion of the Superintendent. **NOTE: You must provide two copies of your recipe, putting your name on the reverse side.**

<u>Set-Up/Presentation:</u> Every entry is allowed a 2'x2' numbered spot on stage. Decorating your spot is optional but an award for decoration of your spot is available for certain categories. Check your category information.

<u>Judging:</u> Competent judges are provided for each category basing decisions on taste, appearance, following directions, etc. Their decisions are final and make no accommodations for views of Fair personnel.

<u>Food Quality</u>: No cooking is done onstage. The Fair provides electrical outlets for your crockpots, coolers, etc. For health and safety reasons, COLD items should be kept below 40 degrees; HOT foods above 140 degrees.

<u>Clean Up/Awards</u>: The competitions have a variety of sponsors, some providing gifts to the winner, which are given at the time of the competition. Fair premiums are available from the Fair Office (back door) on Sunday, September 11th, from 12noon to 8 PM. We are not responsible for items left in the stage area following competitions.
